WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

Ministry of the Lay Eucharistic Visitor

This group meets in the morning and afternoon. Participants must attend both sessions.

“I was hungry and you fed me.” The Ministry of the Lay Eucharistic Visitor extends the celebration of Holy Communion to those who are unable to attend the gathering of the faithful – the home-bound, those in hospital, and those in nursing homes.

This daylong course leads to the licensing by the bishop. The morning session will look at Biblical, theological, and historical background, while in the afternoon we will discuss resources and practical considerations such as HIPAA rules, safety, and health concerns.

Incorporating New Members into the Episcopal Church

This group meets in the morning and afternoon. Participants must attend both sessions.

This daylong class is for clergy and laity who want their parishes to do a more faithful and effective job of drawing people into a deep and lasting relationship with Jesus Christ and his Church. The course will introduce a simple, easy-to-understand process of incorporating new members into a congregation; describe the various kinds of visitors and newcomers; show how to integrate the worship and theology of the Episcopal Church into our evangelism and provide methods to help new people become integral members of a parish. The class will also provide useful tools to help a congregation’s leadership evaluate the invitation, welcome and incorporation process of a parish.

Prayer Shawls and Charity Knitting

Ecumenical and Interfaith Opportunities

We live in a multi-faith world, and our Christian faith is made up of many denominations. This workshop is designed to provide information and resources so that congregations can live out their ministry more fully with partners of other Christian denominations and other faiths. There will be some teaching about the basics of ecumenical and interfaith ideas and documents, as well as time for participants to share their situations and see how they and their parishes can enter into dialogue and ministry with these partners. There will be a special emphasis on building relationships with Muslims, in light of the Diocesan Convention resolution.
